My friend, Monsieur Henri Stucki of Basle, has sent me your paper containing the report of the speech made at Geneva on the 17th inst., when the Swiss Foreign Minister opposed the admission of the U.R.S.S. to the League of Nations.

It will be 30 years next year when I first went to lecture to the Swiss Institute, and I have been very many times since and had very pleasant evenings. I was even present at that famous meeting of Swiss in London, when the question was considered as to whether she should join the League.

I have had the very good fortune to meet many Swiss whom I admire for their many virtues and for the healthy sanity of their Government.

But Sir, I was never prouder of your country than I am to-day after reading through the speech of your Foreign Minister. It is short, it is courageous, it is true, and above all, it is necessary.

It may truly be said "Switzerland has not lost its soul; it has only added an unforgettable laurel to its honorable history."

My prayer to-day is that the blessings of God be with M. Motta and Switzerland in this hour of her true greatness.

Is the speech to be printed and circulated? It might be done along with a portrait of your fine man.

Four matches played in the National League and only two clubs, Basel and Servette with maximum points. Lausanne and Bern 7 points and Lugano 5 points (three drawn games) are undefeated. These five occupy the leading places in the table. Grasshoppers are seventh and it appears that this famous club has not yet got over the many difficulties that have come their way. A goal total of 3 for, 3 against in four matches points to trouble. The loss of Trello Abegglen of international fame, who has joined F.C. Sochaux in Paris, the departure of Rohr, the German international centreforward after playing a few games only at the end of last season (a mysterious affair, apparently due to a withdrawal by the authorities of his permit to reside in Switzerland) seem to have caused a serious breakdown in the scoring machine. In addition, we understand that Mr. Willy Escher, President and beneficial patron of the Grasshopper Club, has withdrawn after many years, and this factor alone would be quite sufficient to cause at least temporary confusion. Yet, the resources of the Club are such that one may expect with all confidence an early return of their usual prominent position in Swiss football. And what about the famous Young Boys of Berne? They too appear to be under a cloud. Eleventh in the table with but two points from two drawn games, 8 goals for and 14 against, speaks volumes. Here also, the old glorious traditions of the Y. B. will have their beneficial influence. The cry, "What is wrong with Young Boys" is sure to be answered by the players of the club effectively

in the near future, and they will return to their usual pre-eminence long before the end of the season. For the new-comer Carouge, we can have less confidence. They have made a disastrous start, scoring but once in four matches and conceding 13 goals. They occupy the last place in the table and we are afraid they will find it extremely difficult to vacate same, with their present team of all amateurs. Well, we shall see!
