The active members gave an excellent account of themselves, one of those occasions when everything simply goes right, and the work was good enough for any medium size society at home; a compliment which speaks for itself. Mr. Lepori performed his *Kunstturnerfreibewegung*, which is good enough for any competition at home, without a flaw in spite of injury.
