## SWISS RECEPTION COMMITTEE FOR THE OLYMPIC GAMES.

The Swiss Olympic Committee, who some time ago appointed me as their Attaché, *i.e.* Liaison Officer with the Organising Committee for the Olympic Games in London, has asked me to form a Reception Committee. The task of this Committee will consist in delegating one or two of its members to meet each Swiss contingent of competitors, for instance the athletes, the rifle team, the boxers, etc., on their arrival in London. During the Games (July 29th — August 14th), the members of the Reception Committee will be expected to assist the managers of the various Swiss teams in such matters as making arrangements for sight-seeing tours of the competitors, etc. These services will, of course, have to be on an honorary basis.

Switzerland is competing in the following events: Athletics, Basket-Ball, Boxing, Canoeing, Cycling, Equestrian, Fencing, Gymnastics, Hockey, Modern Pentathlon, Rowing, Shooting, Swimming, Wrestling, Yachting.

I appeal to those members of the Swiss Colony who wish to help our sportsmen to enjoy their stay in the United Kingdom, to send in their names, addresses and telephone numbers to me.
