EDITOR'S POST-BAG.

Dear Mr. Stauffer,

I should be most grateful if you would be good enough and publish the following apology:—

On the back of the Menu Card for the Dinner in honour of Général Guisan the names of the Swiss Societies and Institutions were printed. Between the "Union Helvetia" and the "Cercle Genevois" appeared "Swiss Club (Schweizerbund)." When I received the proof I crossed out "Swiss Club" and brought forward the name "Schweizerbund" thinking it would look nice to have, by a sheer chance, our three national languages following each other. By a most regrettable error the Printers forgot to re-insert the name after taking out "Swiss Club" so that the name of one of our oldest Swiss Societies has been left out. I am very distressed about it and have written to the President, Mr. Siegrist. I stated in my Speech that we had 22 Societies and yet only 21 were mentioned on the Menu which was delivered only an hour or so before the Dinner started. Nobody seems to have noticed it, it would have given me an opportunity to state the error at the Dinner. I express herewith my very sincere regrets to the President and all Members of the Schweizerbund for this most deplorable error.
