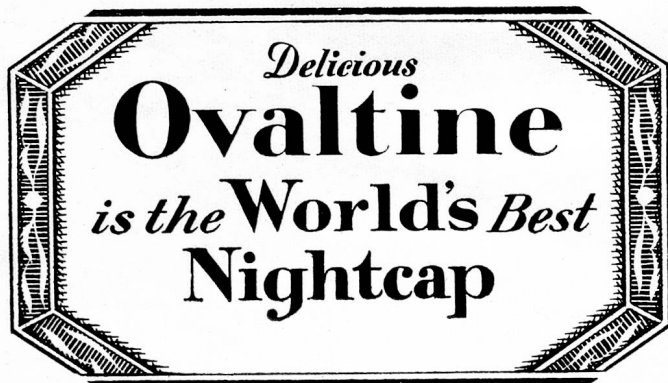
The City Swiss Club hopes, as on former occasions to welcome a number of distinguished personalities at their next month's Banquet.

Professor Rappard, Monday, November 14th.

The series will begin next Monday, November 14th, with a lecture (given in English) by Professor Rappard and will be given in the Council Chamber of the Royal Institute of International Affairs, Chatham House, 10, St. James's Square, at 5.45 p.m. Professor D. L. Savory, M.P., a Patron of the Anglo-Swiss Society, will preside.

The Anglo-Swiss Society extends to all readers of The Swiss Observer a cordial invitation to be present on this occasion as their guests.

Professor Rappard besides being the Director of the Graduate Institute of International Studies in Geneva, has been a member of diplomatic missions to the U.S.A., France and Great Britain, a Delegate of the League of Nations Assembly and a member of the International Labour Organisation.

ANGLO-SWISS SOCIETY'S RECITAL.

The reception and recital organised for the Swiss singer, Madame Nina Nuesch, by the Anglo-Swiss Society on November 3rd, proved a considerable success. Nina Nuesch sang with consummate artistry a few groups of songs by Schubert, Brahms and the well-known Swiss composer Othmar Schoeck, Loeve Rauter, the distinguished accompanist, accompanied Mme. Nuesch. He needed all his vast experience and skill to overcome the handicap of a disgracefully bad piano on which he had to play.
