

Swiss artist's exhibition of paintings in Manchester

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SWISS ARTIST'S EXHIBITION OF PAINTINGS IN MANCHESTER.

We have much pleasure in informing readers in the North of England that our compatriot, Mr. Richard Weisbrod, of Darwen, Lancashire, will hold a one-man exhibition of some 40 paintings in oil and water-colour at the Mid-day Studios, 96, Mosley Street, Manchester 2.

The exhibition will be opened at 3 p.m. on Saturday, January 29th, by our Vice-Consul, Mr. J. J. Huber, and Mr. Weisbrod's works will be on view for some 3 or 4 weeks.

Although our talented compatriot did not take up painting seriously until some 4 years ago, he already has a number of highly successful paintings to his credit, some of which have been shown at local exhibitions of Northern Art Societies, as well as in the Galleries of the Royal Society of British Artists. His subjects show a wide range of scenes, from the places he knows best — Switzerland, Paris and Lancashire — as well as some still lives.

A well-known art critic has described as outstanding characteristics of his work: brightness, a definite and individual style, a sensitiveness to colour combination and a strongly developed feeling for design. He paints in the modern manner — but not too modern — and is said by another critic to be entirely successful in capturing the pictorial character and atmosphere of his subjects.

Mr. Weisbrod has recently held a very successful one-man show at the Lewis Gallery in Blackburn and we wish him equal success in Manchester.

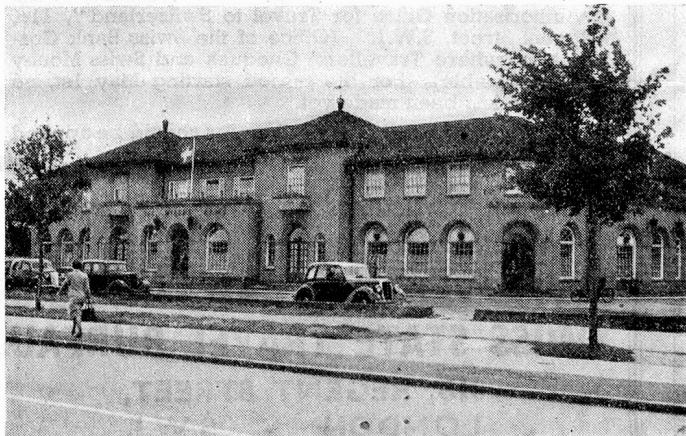
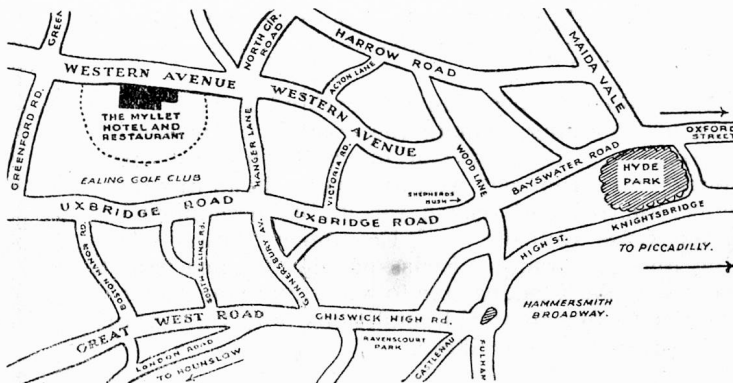
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
