**SWISS NATIONAL DAY
RALLY ON 1ST AUGUST!**

According to a much canvassed wish the 1st of August Committee has decided to make the daring experiment of holding the National Day Celebration of our Colony really on the 1st of August, although it is on a Sunday. Furthermore another innovation, that of holding it in the open, weather permitting, is being tried out on this occasion. The London County Council has given us a booking for the Concert Pavillion in the Pleasure Gardens of Battersea Park. Alternative accommodation in the "Vauxhall Beer Gardens" Pavillion, 50 yards away also in the Pleasure Gardens, has been secured in case of rain. It is there, where in the interval refreshments can be obtained, including Bartholdi-Sausages, and where after the celebration from 6.45 p.m. to 10.45 p.m. a dance is being held. Thus in four ways new ground is being broken. We are reverting much nearer again to the conception of a popular day of enjoyment as well as National celebration to which we are accustomed at home.

The celebration, of which full details advertised in this issue, will begin at 3 p.m. and end at 5.45 p.m. with an hour's interval in between. The Minister, M. Henry de Torrenté, will give the patriotic address, the National Pact will this year be read in the original medieval language. The rest of the programme is entirely made up of short contributions from our local talents and organizations. Tickets of admission to the celebration must be obtained in advance (free of charge) from Miss Morosi, 20, Briston Grove, Crouch Hill, N.8. These tickets should be retained by those wishing to attend the dance after the celebration, for which however, 2/6 will be payable on admission, which is strictly limited to holders of the celebration tickets. A full choice of refreshments at the usual prices is promised by Fortés Management, the licensees of the Catering in the Battersea Pleasure Gardens, including even wine and beer.


