## AMBASSADOR'S UNOFFICIAL VISIT

His Excellency the Swiss Ambassador to Great Britain, Monsieur A. Daeniker and Madame Daeniker who have been on an official visit to Jersey, came to Guernsey on August 5th. After spending two hours in Herm, they were taken to the Elizabethan Grill at St.Peter-in-the-Wood during the lunch hour, and for a drive along the west coast, stopping at Cobo Bay before visiting the vineyards of Mr. R. Le Page at Maresquet, Vale and the fig houses and the treasures of the old Guernsey kitchen of Miss H. G. Ogier at Duvaux Farm, where they signed the visitors' book. His Excellency and Madame Daeniker were highly delighted with all they had seen in the Channel Islands and expressed their intention to return here. Madame Daeniker said the scenery here reminded her of the Adriatic.

It may be recalled that the Duchess of Kent signed Miss Ogier's visitors book in 1948 after inspecting the famous over 100 years old fig tree, which unfortunately died about two years ago.
