As usual, it was a well-attended gathering. The President, Dr. H. W. Egli, was in the chair. The Annual Report was the main item on the agenda and it was evident from it that the Society was a very active one. Several loyal members had been lost during the past year, but fortunately new members had been gained. Increasing commitments and expenses compelled the Council to propose an increase of the membership subscription. But even at 25/- it was very reasonable, considering that monthly lectures and talks of a high standard, concerts and film shows presented in pleasing surroundings at the Swiss Hostel were arranged throughout the year. The untiring President and his Officers are to be congratulated on their achievements.

These feelings were suitably expressed by Monsieur W. Roch, representing the Swiss Ambassador, when he addressed the members and friends at the dinner which followed the Meeting. The Ambassador and Madame Daeniker were prevented from attending and Monsieur and Madame Roch brought their greetings and good wishes. The President expressed appreciation of the interest the Ambassador and the Embassy in general took in the welfare of the N.S.H. and went on to welcome the guests. He thanked the Hostel, its warden, Miss R. Preiswerk, and in particular Miss C. Hagenbuch for looking after the culinary needs of members and friends in such an outstanding way. Dr. Egli also thanked Monsieur Roch for providing the Kirsch with the coffee and an anonymous donor for presenting the ladies with embroidered handkerchiefs.

Mr. A. F. Suter, the active octogenarian, recalled the high days of the Society when it counted many hundreds of members. He told of how numbers dwindled and of how the N.S.H. was re-vitalised; during his reminiscences he singled out three people who had left their mark on the development of the Group, the first (paid) Secretary, Dr. Arnold Laett, the indefatigable Hon. Secretary, Mr. C. Campart, and Mrs. Clara Mueller who had worked so hard in the interest of the N.S.H. and who had recently died.

When dinner was over and time came to leave, all present were convinced that the evening had been a most enjoyable one and that the Nouvelle Société Helvétique was well worthy of support.
