# NEWS FROM THE COLONY

#### W. BECKMANN †

It is with deep regret that we announce the death on 2nd October of Mr. W. Beckmann of 46 Chemin de Pierrefleur, Lausanne.

Mr. Beckmann was born in Zurich in 1891, where he received his schooling. He finished his education in Basle at the Obere Realschule. After his military service (Rekrutenschule and Unteroffiziersschule), he made an apprenticeship with Schlotterbeck's. In 1912, he came to London. For some three years he worked with an engineering firm and then joined the World Transport Company. On 1st June 1931, he founded his own business of Cosmos Freightways Agency Ltd. which he developed with much success. At the end of May 1962, he sold his business to his compatriot and partner, Mr. A. Strittmatter. He remained on the Board of Messrs. Bruce, Dawson & Co. (London) Ltd. (manufacturers of Trucks and Dowels) until July 1963, when he and his wife retired to Switzer-

Mr. Beckmann was a founder member of the Institute of Shipping and Forwarding Agents and for many years Auditor of the London Branch.

Mr. Beckmann took a keen interest in the affairs of the Swiss community in this country. He was a member of the one-time Swiss Institute, the City Swiss Club, the Swiss Mercantile Society, the Nouvelle Société Helvétique.

In all his activities he was supported loyally by his wife to whom our deep sympathy goes in her grief. His death is mourned also by his daughter Mrs. Eric Housego, her husband and her two children (in Nottinghamshire), as well as by the many friends of the Beckmann family, who will remember a staunch and loyal man of many endearing qualities.
