ST. MARY WOOLNOTH AND "MR WILBERFORCE, M.P."

A new play has opened at the Westminster Theatre, Palace Street, S.W.1, "Mr. Wilberforce, M.P." by Alan Thornhill. Two of the scenes take place in the crypt of St. Mary Woolnoth Church, Lombard Street, E.C., where the German-speaking congregation of the Swiss Church holds its services. The man who was Rector of that church at the time of Wilberforce, the Rev. Newton, is one of the main characters in the play. Newton used to be captain of a slave ship and was later converted, became a minister of religion and took up the battle to end the evil of the slave trade. He challenged Wilberforce at St. Mary Woolnoth to take up the issue in Parliament. Wilberforce fought it with great courage and conviction. Another character in the play is Young Pitt, the brilliant Prime Minister. Wilberforce was his closest friend. For twenty years he was thwarted by the opposition and intrigue of Henry Dundas, powerful controller of the party machine on whom Pitt depended for votes and for the vigorous prosecution of the War.

Harold Hobson of the "Sunday Times" said that it was an excellent play "a straight forward, well-written, brightly acted, always interesting narrative of the campaign against the slave trade."
