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THE CHALLENGE OF THE LEISURE SOCIETY

This is the title of a talk to be given to the London Group of the Nouvelle Société Helvétique on Thursday, 4th October, 7 p.m. at the Swiss Embassy, 16/18 Montagu Place, W1. The speaker will be the eminent Swiss author and philosopher DR. LORENZ STUCKI.

He is well qualified to give an address on this subject, having made extensive research in USA and elsewhere. He has just had a book published on this problem which is of growing importance as working hours become shorter and leisure more prolonged. It is a fundamental aspect of today's industrial society, which is often overlooked. The speaker will talk about chances and perils of the leisure society and what is being done in various countries, more especially in Switzerland.

Dr. Stucki is widely travelled and one of the most versatile personalities in Swiss cultural life. Apart from journalistic activities, he is the author of many outstanding works covering the USA, China, and East Asia, but also of books on Switzerland, a modern world history and a remarkable book on democracy. Many of his works have been translated into other languages.

All Swiss and their friends are most welcome and they may be assured of a most interesting evening.

On Thursday, 18th October, a concert in aid of the Swiss Churches will be held at the Embassy under the auspices of the Nouvelle Société Helvétique. Details will be announced later.

Ski Exhibition in London

An unprecedented "Ski Show" will be held in London from 5th-9th September at the Old Horticultural Hall, Westminster. This exhibition is sponsored by the *Daily Mail* and the Tourist Association of the Alpes Vaudoises, which comprises the winter sports resorts of Chateau-d'Oex, Les Diablerets, Leysin and Villars. Members of the Swiss National Team are expected to demonstrate their skills on an artificial slope. The skiers include Jean-Daniel Daetwyler, Olympic bronze medallist and twice Swiss champion for descent, Michel Dätwyler, also a descent specialist, Willy Favre, Olympic silver medallist and former Swiss descent and giant slalom champion. Several Swiss tourist personalities, hoteliers and skiing instructors are expected to be in London during the show.
