

Aim of the Congress

The traditional objectives of IABSE congresses are to bring together every fourth year colleagues from all over the world and from all the different branches of the structural engineering profession, in order to exchange views and to broaden the individual engineer's knowledge and insight into future problems of the profession, as well as to provide information on new tools for design, decision making, and practical implementation.

General Format

A challenging technical programme is being prepared, crossing the boundaries of purely structural engineering. Nowadays we all have to remind ourselves that we are living in a limited space – the Earth. We have to cooperate with and respect our fellowmen, nature and future generations.

«Civilization through Civil Engineering»: this is the motto of the Congress and the objective that all IABSE members and Congress participants want to attain.

The Technical Programme will consist of Plenary Sessions, Special Sessions, Seminars, Teach-Ins, Design Workshop and Poster sessions. To complete the programme, technical films will be shown, a technical/commercial exhibition will be organized, and technical tours proposed. A social programme as well as post-congress tours will also be offered to Congress participants and accompanying persons.
