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Die Entdeckung des Pesterregers durch A. Yersin (Hongkong 1894) und die Pestpandemie, die in den ersten dreissig Jahren unseres Jahrhunderts die Welt umspannte, führte zu einer Lawine aufregender Entdeckungen, die die Übertragungsmechanismen und ökologischen Zusammenhänge dieser alten Seuche erklärten und die Sicht der historischen Pestzüge revolutionierten. Mit seiner Studie, die am Medizinhistorischen Institut der Universität Zürich entstand, schlägt der Arzt H. Kupferschmidt die Brücke zwischen den epidemiologischen Vorstellungen des 19. Jahrhunderts und dem, was wir heute über diese Infektionskrankheit wissen.
