## PETER WYSSBROD

Peter Wyssbrod, born on 10th January, 1938 at Biel, obtained a degree at the School of Fine Arts in his home town. After graduating, he worked first of all as graphic designer and painter, later as stage-designer. During this time, he also played as amateur actor in "Das letzte Band", a translation of Samuel

Beckett's "Krapp's last Tape". From 1965 to 1968, he studied pantomime under Herald Kreuzberg, Susanne Bastide and Ernst Georg Böttger. Peter Wyssbrod has performed in Switzerland, the Netherlands, Belgium and Austria. His latest one-man play "Le Grand Départ" was first performed at the Theatre Festival 1976 at Stavelot, Belgium.

## ETIENNE BARILIER

The Swiss writer Etienne Barilier was born in 1947. He was educated in Lausanne, taking a first degree at the local University in 1971 and his doctorate in the spring of 1977. He spent one of the intervening years as assistant at Lausanne University, and three at the Swiss Institute in Rome, where he prepared his doctoral thesis on Albert Camus.
